Alan Bentley – Moving Pictures

Allen Bentley is making his mark with images of swimming couples and bustling dancers made of quick, energetic touches. At our meeting, he will talk about process in art. Process is the working and reworking of your art that adds integrity and tangibility. Through these generations of change your work takes on a life of its own that usually exceeds your original intent. Bentley will also discuss the pitfalls of working from photographs and how to avoid them. Hear how Bentley implements these philosophies and techniques to create paintings and drawings of dynamic motion.

He received his Masters of Fine Art from the University of Pennsylvania in 2000 and his Bachelors of Fine Art from Western Carolina University in 1996. Bentley was represented by the Bridgette Mayer Gallery in Philadelphia from 2001 to 2013. He has exhibited across the country, with solo exhibitions in Philadelphia, New York, Chicago, and San Diego. He has shown in the Philadelphia International Airport and in Artworks at the Philadelphia Museum of Art. In 2009, Bentley had his first solo museum show at the Delaware Center for the Contemporary Arts in Wilmington, DE.

He teaches Figure Drawing and Drawing at Montgomery College in Rockville, MD and serves as chair of the Christopher Lyon Scholarship selection committee at the University of Pennsylvania.

Allen Bentley Workshop

Learn the importance of process in your art. This workshop will focus on a drawing philosophy where reworking is crucial and there are no mistakes. This workshop builds off Bentley's talk and shows how using a simple 3" bristle brush can quickly develop your charcoal drawing.

Materials needed: drawing paper, compressed charcoal sticks (not pencils) Extra soft works best, white plastic eraser

Shows – Bob Maarsen

Adventist HealthCare White Oak Medical Center

I recently had a chance to visit this new facility prior to the official opening on August 26, 2019. I met up with Jovorka Saracevi who helped design the facility and is coordinating many of the last-minute details. We talked about using the hospital as a venue for one of GFAA shows. Her response was that they don't have staff at this time to manage and coordinate shows that would change on an ongoing basis. In addition, most of the hospital areas couldn't handle framed artwork because of sanitary conditions however, they may be interested in artwork for their office space, that would become part of their permanent collection in addition to using artwork in a digitized form to display on their monitors and overhead screens.

They are looking for nature scenes, calm peaceful artwork with no dark shadows and no people or animals in the artwork.

In some parts of the hospital they can't hang artwork or have wallpaper but a wall fresco is a possibility.

As you can imagine, last-minute details for such a large facility are constantly changing. In addition, there is a planned pavilion that could possibly house artwork and Jovorka will be working on that facility is addition to the Riderwood Retirement Facility.

I'd like for our members to send me pictures of existing artwork that meet the criteria specified above. Please give me artist name, artwork title, media, size unframed and price. Please label your JPG file Lastname_FirstName_ArtworkTitle.JPG. More than one piece of artwork is acceptable.

The deadline for submitting pictures of artwork is September 20th. The sooner you get your pictures in, the better your chance of a sale!!

BIG INK Arts Opportunity at Pyramid Atlantic

Deadline September 9th, 2019



BIG INK is traveling to Pyramid Atlantic in 2019. Pyramid Atlantic has invited BIG INK to host a two-day event where prints will be pulled from large-scale woodblock plates.

BIG INK is seeking image proposals from emerging, mid-career, and established visual artists who would like to carve a woodblock, at least 24" x 36" inches in dimension, to print at each event. No prior printmaking experience is required. Any artist that has an interest in print media and wants to achieve a deeper understanding of woodblock carving is welcome to apply.

Upon completing the online application and being accepted, artists will have two months prior to the event to carve their design. BIG INK has assembled how-to videos that guide participants through the carving process. The series draws from invaluable technical observations made by BIG INK's directors and past participating artists. The artists' sole responsibility is to bring a fully carved and ready to print woodblock on their assigned printing day. All consumable materials including paper, ink, cleaning supplies and equipment are included with participation.

The event, to occur on November 16th & 17th, is an excellent way to network with other participants, plug into a growing creative community, and produce high-quality work that can later be used for sale and exhibition.


